## What do I take?

- 3 Higher Level courses\*
- 3 Standard Level courses\*
- Extended Essay (independent)
- Theory of Knowledge (TOK)
- Creativity, Action, Service (CAS)

\* 4 HL 2 SL is rare, not necessary for uni, makes it harder to earn the Diploma, and requires multiple recommendations



- 7 points possible per course, up to 3 additional points possible with EE and TOK
- must complete EE, TOK, CAS (EE/TOK have assessments; CAS has learning outcomes)
- must earn at least a 24 (and if total is less than 28, must have 12+ points in HLs)
